To the Vinton-Shellsburg School Community,

Welcome to the 2019-2020 school year! It's always time of year when I think to myself, "Ready or not, here they come!" I am confident we will be ready to serve our students!

Our buildings and classrooms will be ready. Our custodians and maintenance crews have been thoroughly cleaning the classrooms and buildings. We had some outside crews work with some asbestos abatement, roof work, painting large areas, installing cement, and several other projects. We are finishing up a remodeling project at the central office to be more handicap accessible and have a buzz-in system similar to other buildings. This also gave us the opportunity to repaint and replace some of the carpet.

Our administrators have worked to fill open positions with new staff who will bring experience, training and enthusiasm to their jobs. We will have several new teachers and support staff positions as well as people who are transferring into new positions within the district. This includes Louise Fleming as our Facilitator of Teaching and Learning and Aric Chvala who will be an instructional coach at the high school.

Our technology will be ready. Several students and staff members have worked to make sure our computers are ready for staff and students and we will have the high school laptops ready to issue in early August. (We appreciated the community's support in the purchase of our old laptops — all of them were sold in a timely manner!)

Our food service program will be ready. Our Shellsburg and Tilford kitchens and staff were busy all summer as we provided the summer meal program. We continued to serve more meals than in previous years and some days had well over 300 meals served! We anticipate continuing our strong partnership with our Farm-to-School group in offering more locally sourced and made-from-scratch items on our menus.

Our transportation department will be ready. We are modifying our routes and so there will be some adjustments in pick-up and drop-off times. Please contact the bus barn if you have specific questions.

Most importantly, our teaching staff will be ready! Many of our teachers have been attending conferences and classes as they improve their skills and expand the opportunities we can offer our students. This has included college courses and workshops. Le Cox was a part of training in Washington DC and Kelly Steffen continued her learning at Valley Forge!

All registrations will be done via the PowerSchool program again this year. If you choose to come to the Registration Day on August 8, there will be staff available to assist you in the registration process.

RevTrak will be the preferred use of payment for online registration. There will NOT be a convenience charge again this year for anyone that eRegisters AND pays online via RevTrak through August 8, 2019. If you so choose to pay by check or cash, you will need to come to Registration Day at the High School on August 8th to pay your registration fees. We will be able to process fees paid with a debit card or charge card at the High School this year. Online fees will be for full price only, no waivered amounts will be offered. If you believe you qualify for free and reduced fees then you will need to attend Registration Day and complete the paperwork to see if your family qualifies. You won't be able to pay online, but you will still be required to complete the eRegistration process online. NOTE: Textbook fees must be paid prior to activity passes being issued. If you were invoiced for computer damage or loss for the 2018-19 school year, payment is due at this time.

Options for registration include:

- You can eRegister online, but pay at school;
- You can eRegister and pay full price on-line with a credit /debit card;
- ♦ You can come in and complete eRegistration and payment by cash, check, or credit card at the high school on August 8.

Medication Policy

It is the policy of the Vinton-Shellsburg Community School District that whenever a student has medication, prescription or otherwise, that is to be administered by school personnel, written authorization and instruction must be provided by a parent or legal guardian. Medication release forms are also available in each nurse's office. No Medication will be given WITHOUT WRITTEN PERMISSION. This includes ASPIRIN, ANT-ACIDS and COUGH DROPS. Only the school nurse or trained personnel will administer the medication upon request of the parent. The medication must be in the original container, stating the child's name, name of the medication, the time medication is to be given and the dosage. Students who have demonstrated competence in administering their own medications may administer their medication when a written statement by the student's parent is on file requesting co-administration of the medication when competence has been demonstrated. By law, students with asthma or other airway constricting diseases may self-administer their medication upon approval of their parents and prescribing physician regardless of competency.

IMMUNIZATION REQUIREMENTS

An immunization record is required for everyone attending public or non public schools.

Elementary/secondary requirements: Dtap-5 doses; Polio-4 doses; MMR-2 doses; Hepatitis B-series of 3; Varicella-2 doses or history of Chicken pox. Kindergarten requirements: Lead screen, Vision screen, and Dental screen. Third grade: Vision screen.

7th Grade: The lowa Department of Public health is now requiring that all 7th graders receive a booster of tetanus, diphtheria and pertussis (Tdap) It is recommend that students in the higher grades receive a booster of Tdap. 9th Grade: Dental screen

If your student has not received the required booster please do so before the school year starts. If you have any questions or concerns feel free to contact the school nurse at 319-436-4728 or Kristin.hallberg@yscsd.org. Our school district is required to have a current immunization record or an exemption for every student. The IDPD audits this every year.

School officials cannot allow your child to enter school unless the child has a completed certificate of immunization or an exemption on file. Please bring the completed immunization certificate or exemption when registering your child.

ANNUAL NOTICE OF OPEN ENROLLMENT PROCEDURES

Following are highlights of the open enrollment procedures as mandated by the lowa Legislature. This information does not cover the entire open enrollment legislation. Non-kindergarten filing deadline is March Ist and kindergarten filing deadline is September Ist. Parent/guardian must file Open Enrollment forms with BOTH the receiving district AND the resident district. The RECEIVING district approves or denies the application. The exception to this rule is if the RESIDENT district has a desegregation plan in place or a claim of pervasive harassment or serious health condition the resident district must act upon the application first.

2020-2021 Deadlines Timeline / Procedures

• <u>Before March I</u>, <u>of the Preceding School Year</u>: Parent/Guardian sends application to <u>BOTH</u> the resident and receiving districts. If the student is entering kindergarten, the application may be made after <u>March I</u> until the deadline of <u>September I</u>.

Parents should be aware that open enrollment may result in the loss of athletic eligibility at the varsity level of competition for the first 90 school days of open enrollment. A separate form must be completed for each pupil requesting open enrollment. In most instances, a parent requesting open enrollment is responsible for providing transportation for the open enrolled student. However, if your family income falls within the Federal poverty guidelines you are eligible for financial assistance for transportation purposes. - "Good Cause" Exception to March I Deadline: Applications may be approved after the March I deadline if the reason for late filing qualifies for "good cause."

Activity Tickets

Students who purchase an activity ticket during registration will receive a Green colored ID card the first day of school as long as required fees and all other overdue fees are paid in full. Those students who do not purchase an activity ticket will receive the usual Gold ID card. Should you purchase an activity ticket later, you will need to turn in your Gold ID card and you will be issued a Green ID card as long as required fees and all other overdue fees are paid in full. There will be a \$5 replacement charge for ID's if you should lose them and need another one reprinted.
