To the Vinton-Shellsburg School Community,

When I was in choir in high school, we sang a song with the lines, "Everyone talks about the weather. We cannot do a thing about it." The melody has played many times in my head over the last few weeks. What a winter we've had...so far! Let's hope that March comes in like a lamb and stays that way all month!

Snow Make-up Days – We have missed many days due to the weather. The board approved revisions to the 2018-19 calendar for the snow days up through February 13th. This includes having students attend school on February 18, March 15, April 18, April 22, May 30 and May 31. Because our original 2018-19 calendar was based on hours and well-exceeded the 1080 hours, we had extra hours and can "absorb" some of the snow days. However, we certainly do not want to only meet the minimum number of hours if possible. We are also working on how we will revise our teachers' and support staff contract days as it gives us the opportunity to offer some different trainings.

Even though it seems we are struggling to get into a regular routine for this year, we are already working on the 2019-20 school year. This includes work on the calendar, the budget, the staffing plan and the summer building projects.

Calendar: The Calendar Committee will have a recommendation for next year's calendar at the March 11th board meeting. The feedback we received from our annual survey showed that parents and community:

Prefer Fridays for our early-outs and no-school days.

Want the Wednesday before Thanksgiving to be a no-school day.

Want the holiday break to begin after school on Friday, December 20th.

Want to have several snow make-up days built into the calendar.

Prefer to be done with school in May.

I anticipate the school year will start on Friday, August 23. While starting on a Friday is not my first choice, it is the first day we can legally start school. Both Christmas and New Year's will be on a Wednesday next year so I anticipate a longer break.

Budget: The school board will have their budget workshop on Monday, March 11 at the high school. We will again be having hard conversations about how to maintain quality programs during a time of financial challenges. Over the last several years, the growth in our spending has been well under the rate of inflation which indicates we are making adjustments were possible. We are a people business – more than 80% of our expenditures go towards salaries and benefits. The board will also be exploring paying off more of our bonds early which will save taxpayers interest payments over time (they already reduced the tax burden by \$1,000,000 by refinancing a few years ago).

Staffing: At the February board meeting, the board accepted early retirement applications for Gail Showman, Home School Assistance Program teacher and director; Teresa Wilson, Tilford teacher; Diane Higgins, Tilford teacher; Ann Janecheck, Tilford teacher; Cheryl Jorgensen, Tilford teacher; Judy Mumm, associate at Shellsburg; Barb Salger, high school secretary; Julie Long, associate at the Middle School; and Les Bearbower, Director of Building and Grounds. The Administrative Team is considering overall staffing plans for next year.

Summer Projects: We use I-cent local option dollars along with voter approved physical plant and equipment levy (PPEL) funds to pay for busses, new roofs, flooring, technology and other "physical" parts of the school district. Our Expanded Administrative Team (directors, principals) is finalizing a list of recommendations to present to the school board for their review and approval. The plans include a new bus barn; removal of asbestos flooring at the Middle School; upgrades to many restrooms across the district; new lighting and ceiling tile; and many other projects across the district.

V-S High School has begun student course requests for the 2019-2020 school year. The guidance department has met with each grade level to discuss course options, the course request process, and timelines. Junior student course request sheets are due March 6 and Freshman/Sophomore student course request sheets are due March 12. All student course request sheets should be turned into their respected Advisor. The software system in PowerSchool will help determine placement of classes within the master schedule trying to avoid as many conflicts as possible. The guidance department will also manipulate the placement of some courses as well as to avoid conflicts that PowerSchool did not recognize. Our goal is to have all student schedules completed and finalized by the end of the school year.

MIDDLE SCHOOL NEWS

Standards based grading..... What is this about at the middle school?

How is this different from a traditional grading system?

In a traditional grading system, students receive an overall percentage score, aligned to a letter grade, in each subject area. Standards-Based Grading differs by providing specific information to you related to specific standards.

How will this benefit students?

Standards-Based Grading provides parents and students with more accurate, consistent and meaningful feedback to support learning. In addition, teachers will be able to provide more specific instruction based on student mastery of the standards.

How do teachers determine performance levels?

Teachers will examine a variety of evidence to determine a student's proficiency level on each standard. Evidence will include, but is not limited to, work samples, presentations, projects, tests, quizzes, etc. Teachers will continually be teaching and assessing to provide your student with the instruction they need to support and challenge their learning.

How can I support my child?

- Ask your child specific questions about school and listen to and comment on his/her answers.
- Ask your child to see their assignments and discuss his/her performance.
- Discuss ways that your child will need to use the knowledge and skills learned in school to succeed in work.
- Maintain an open and on-going dialogue with your child's teachers.

Attendance Matters!

We take attendance seriously at VSMS, unfortunately Mother Nature has not been as serious about attendance for us in January and February. On the days we've been in school we've had 95% attendance. Thank you very much! As we get back into a normal schedule make sure you encourage your student to get the most out of middle school by attending regularly. Help them understand there is no substitution for being in class. Your child needs to be present to hear teachers explain concepts, to participate in groups, class discussion, and ask questions. Try to schedule doctor, dentist, or orthodontist appointments after school hours whenever possible. We appreciate everything you do to make sure your child is here every day and our attendance numbers show it.

lowa Assessments

Our state testing will be coming up at the end of March. The test is new for everyone. Students will complete the test on a computer and will be given a variety of questions that they will answer in different ways. The new test will not be just the tradition multiple choice questions. Students will have a variety of questions including multiple choice, short answer, essays, and constructing knowing. Please make sure your student has a good nights sleep and has breakfast every morning to prepare them for the day. Middle School testing dates are March 27-April 2.
