To the Vinton-Shellsburg School Community:

It feels like spring has finally arrived! I have never called a no-school day due to snow as late as we did this year – April 18th!

As you may have read or heard, the students' last day will still be on Friday, May 25th with a two-hour early out. Our administrative team was not sure there would be a lot of quality teaching or learning if we asked students to return on the Tuesday after Memorial Day. We have this flexibility in determining the last day because we base our calendar on hours, not days, and our students will have exceeded the 1080 minimum hours required.

It has been a tough season for our spring athletes as our golf, track, soccer and trap shooting teams had their practices and competitions cancelled or postponed. There are many music events and end-of-theyear celebrations that are still scheduled this month.

We recently received results from this spring's Iowa Assessments. When we review the data from each grade level, it is apparent that great things are happening inside our classrooms. We receive data comparing us to other schools in the Grant Wood Area and to the state. In almost every category, our students achieved better than their peers in Grant Wood or across the state. When we review the preliminary data by whether or not students are proficient, we see the following by grade level (the second number is the percent of students who were highly proficient – earning a score above <u>90%</u>). (*Statistically, schools would expect about 60% to be proficient and 10% to be highly proficient.*)

While Iowa Assessments is just one measure of student learning, we can all be proud of the work that our staff and students are doing to do well on this measure!

The culmination of any school's work is graduation. It is a day when we celebrate not only our students' successes but also the success of the preK-high school system that works together in preparing our students for their futures. This year's graduation is at 2:00 on Sunday, May 27th in the Garrison Field House. We anticipate more than 100 students graduating which is up from last year, but still less than what we had a decade ago which is reflective of the overall decline in enrollment for the district.

The first week in May is Teacher and Staff Appreciation Week and May is also when we recognize school board members. We are fortunate to have so many individuals who are a part of the district and who are willing to work together for our students' learning.

This includes the **associates** who work with special education students, lunchroom and recess duty, and work with students to support reading and math development. Our **bus drivers** travel the 235 square miles of our district twice daily plus transport our students to their extracurricular activities; they are the ones kids see first thing in the morning and the last thing at the end of the day! Our **custodians and maintenance** crew manage and clean about 400,000 square feet plus many acres of mowing; they do a great job of keeping things clean, safe and attractive. Our **food service** staff serve over 20,000 lunches each month and about 6,000 breakfasts! They work to make sure food is nutritious, attractive and tasty while working within a tight budget and federal guidelines. Our **building secretaries** are often the first people many of our new families and students meet when they join the district or transition to a new building; our **central office** staff provide support to new employees and they also work with our vendors, other school districts and the entire community. Our students are our purpose, but we are able to excel at that purpose because of the work our **teachers** do within each classroom (see the results from Iowa Assessments to verify). *Continue next page*

Our administrators and directors work individually and collectively to provide leadership and support across the district. Our school board members are the only elected officials in Iowa who are not compensated; they do it because of their interest and passion about students and the district. They work to balance the needs of our students with our taxpayers' interests.

I am proud of the people who are a part of our school district and the work they do to serve the entire school-community. You should be as well! When you see them, take a minute to thank them for the great job they are doing supporting our students.

We are working to update our website and other ways we use social media. We surveyed our parents and community a few weeks ago. The results included:

Almost 300 people responded to the survey (THANK YOU!).

The calendar items (activity and regular school) are accessed the most.

Many people use the links to gain quick access to Power Schools and RevTrack – which means we need to continue having favorite links easily accessible.

Almost 80% of people access our website on their phones – which means that we need to use a format that is easily viewed on a phone's screen! Over half of the respondents indicated they prefer to get their school information via School Messenger, but almost 25% also want to make sure it is on our website.

Many of the respondents access our Facebook page.

People have asked that we keep the information on our website more up-to-date and include more pictures including staff pictures and contact information.

We had several requests to have more information about the bell schedules on the website. We have purposefully excluded that information as that is a recommendation from safety experts.

If any student or parent has a question about the school district, I would encourage him or her to give me a call, send me an e-mail, or stop in. I welcome the opportunity to talk about what is going well (or not so well) in our district.


