To the Vinton-Shellsburg School Community,

I'm not quite ready to start getting up early to listen to the National Weather Association's "situation room" phone calls on bad weather mornings. They have already issued one of their reports that includes snowfall predictions for our area. I would rather enjoy fall days of sunshine and warmer temperatures! The colors on the trees have been especially beautiful this year and I'm not sure the Tilford campus has ever been more beautiful.

As I write this, we have our parent-teacher conferences scheduled for this week. Thank you to the parents who attended to learn more about their children's educational experiences. Our teachers have compiled a great deal of data and information about each student as they prepare for the conversations.

Our fall activities are mostly finished and the winter season's activities are already started. Our marching band received another division I rating at state which is a great accomplishment.

School board elections will be held on Tuesday, November 5. This is a change from having them in September and follows legislative action to align the school's election with city and other votes. We have seven board members who each serve four-year terms. Our district includes at-large positions (which means the candidates can live anywhere in the district) and positions that represent either the former Vinton school district (Director District #1) or the former Shellsburg school district (Director District #2).

We have three individuals who decided not to seek reelection – they include Brenda Bartz, Jason Hicok and Kyle Schminke. The district has greatly benefited from their dedication to students and wiliness to serve the district.

We have four seats on the November ballot. One is an at-large position; Kathy Van Steenhuyse is an incumbent for this position and no one else filed papers for the seat. Two positions will serve Director District #I (the former Vinton school district); we have three people running for the two seats – Tom Burke, Audra Piotti and Becky Williams. The final position will serve Director District #2 (the former Shellsburg school district); lake Fish has filed papers for this position. Please vote! The polls will be open from 7 AM – 8 PM.

We filed several state reports in October. The most exciting news is that our Certified Enrollment shows that we have a few more students this year than last year! We still have more students who open enroll out to other districts than come into us; when we've contacted the families why they open enroll out the overwhelming response has to do with convenience.

As you review the November calendar, notice that we will not have school on the Wednesday before Thanksgiving (November 27). When we survey our families and staff about the upcoming year's calendar, a large majority of respondents tell us they prefer this as a no-school day. Watch for the survey for the 2020-21 calendar in January or February.

Make plans now to attend our annual Veterans' Day program on November 11. It will be at the Middle School and starts at 9:30. I'm confident it is one of the best anywhere in the state.


lowa's History Teacher of the Year

A teacher from the Vinton-Shellsburg Community School District has been named lowa's History Teacher of the Year!

Kelly Steffen is a 19-year teaching veteran at the Vinton-Shellsburg district, spending the last 18 years teaching American history at Vinton-Shellsburg High School. Steffen ensures student engagement by focusing on the relevance presented in historical context.

"I have a special appreciation for teachers who go beyond rote memorization of dates and names," said lowa Department of Education Director Ryan Wise, himself a former social studies teacher. "Kelly makes history come alive by making the subject relevant and engaging. She is a leader in this field."

"Finding relevance is one way I work to engage students," Steffen said. "Another is to utilize primary sources, so that students can draw their own conclusions."



The Gilder Lehrman Institute promotes and celebrates accomplishments in American history education and scholarship, and every year honors one exemplary, elementary, middle, or high school history teacher from all 50 states, Department of Defense schools, Washington, D.C., and U.S. territories. State winners receive a \$1,000 prize, an archive of classroom resources, and recognition at a ceremony in their state, and are considered for the National History Teacher of the Year award.

Why did you become a history teacher?

As an elementary school student, I had a love for all things history. I checked out and read any books connected to history, especially presidential history. The librarian was kind enough to order new books for me once I was done with a certain era. As I moved on to high school, I had a wonderful history teacher at Cedar Rapids' Jefferson, Jim Taylor, whose love for history and our ability to analyze and question it made me realize this was something I wanted to be a part of.

How would you define "social studies," and why is studying it so important?

The disciplines that make up "social studies" teach us how to understand ourselves, how to understand those around us, how to understand our past, and how utilizing this information can help us become educated, contributing members of society. We study social studies, so that we may be well-informed, contributing members of society.

How do you engage your students and make history come alive in your classroom? Why is engaging students important?

Finding relevance is one way I work to engage students. Another is to utilize primary sources, so that students can draw their own conclusions. I hope that my passion is what they feel when we approach topics in class. I have an administration that allows field trips locally and nationally. I promote opportunities that allow students to interact with the public, like hosting a Cold War Museum and inviting community members and administration to observe student work. Engaging students is necessary in order to help build a community of contributing members of society.

How do you emphasize state and local history in your classroom?

This is an area that I am looking to improve and the new social studies standards and resources have been helpful with making that more of a reality. I do invite local veterans to speak about their experiences with 20th century conflicts or other local experts regarding religion or historical events. I also have students visit our local history and Veterans Museum.

What would you like to tell teachers across lowa?

WE ALL work really hard to ensure the best learning opportunities for our students. I feel honored to be surrounded by people who love what they do and inspire the next generation.

Vinton-Shellsburg Viking Regiment

On August 1st, most students were enjoying the last few weeks of summer before school started again on August 23rd. A select few dedicated leaders in the band, however, were learning how they could help their peers have a successful marching band season. The rest of the Vinton-Shellsburg Viking Regiment, the district's high school marching band, joined them on August 5th, and thus, marching band camp had begun. While it may seem unpleasant in the moment, most students agree that band camp is necessary in order to achieve the level of success that they desire. This year, that was especially true. During band camp, the students were able to learn all of the music and half of the drill (movements on the field) that they would need to learn for the whole season in just two weeks! That foundation laid the groundwork for 5th place and three 3rd place finishes throughout the season, along with caption awards for best drum major and best color guard at Bands Across the Prairie, and culminated in the Viking Regiment's 14th consecutive Division I Superior rating at the IHSMA State Marching Festival in Cedar Rapids on October 12th. That performance at state resulted in the highest score (77.8) on file for the Viking Regiment, dating back to 2013 with sporadic scores dating back to 2010, and was 9.8 points higher than the required score of 68 to earn a Division I rating.

Looking to improve on the success from this year, the band is fundraising for new uniforms for the start of the 2020 marching band season! The new uniforms are designed to incorporate a 'V' and an 'S' in the design, with our school black and gold as the primary colors, while incorporating a slightly more contemporary design. Any donation towards these new uniforms would be greatly appreciated! We already have over half of the funds accounted for, and hope to have all funds accumulated by the beginning of February.
