To the Vinton-Shellsburg School Community,

It has been a great start to the new school year! August was a full month with registration, computer checkout nights, back-to-school nights, fall sports and activities starting, and the first days of school! Thank you to all of the parents, grandparents, daycare providers, neighbors and others who help get the 1500+ students to school and back each day.

PPEL Vote – On Tuesday, September 10, there will be an election on whether or not to renew the Physical Plant and Equipment Levy. If approved, it would extend the levy that has been in place since 1989 (when the Shellsburg and Vinton districts combined). It generates about \$700,000 each year and can only be spent on things that are physical – new roofs; new busses; new desks, chairs and other furniture; new cement (including the parking lots); window replacement; computers, etc. It cannot be spent on salaries, insurance or other staffing costs per state law. Polling stations will be open at the Vinton Courthouse, Garrison Fire Station and Shellsburg Legion from 7 AM – 8 PM. Please vote!

School Board Election – The Iowa Legislature changed the law for when school board elections will occur. They will now be in November of every other year. The new law goes into effect this November 5th. We have four seats up for election including those currently served by Kyle Schminke – Director District #2 (the former Shellsburg District), Brenda Bartz and Jason Hicok - Director District #1 (the former Vinton District), and Kathy Van Steenhuyse – at-large member. Anyone interested in running can pick up papers here at Central Office or at the Courthouse. Jim Struve, our activities director, recently compiled a summary of 2018-19 activities and it included that well over 60% of our high school students are involved in at least one sport. We had the highest percentage in recent history with 78% of last year's sophomores involved with at least one sport. We also have a large number of students who participate in speech, drama and music as well as other co-curricular activities. The research is clear that when students are involved in activities (or multiple activities), they are more likely to do well in school and graduate.

Over the summer, we had many building upgrades completed using our PPEL and I-cent local option (SAVE) money. This included installing new cement east of the Shellsburg building and upgrading their playground area. We also abated asbestos in several rooms at the middle school and installed new flooring, lights and ceiling in those rooms. We are finalizing a project at the central office so the entrance is now on the south side of the building and is handicapped accessible (no more half-step when you come in the door!). We will be installing a buzz-in system similar to what is used in the buildings. In a year of more rain than most for much of the early summer, we kept our lawns mowed! The custodians, painters, and maintenance crew did a GREAT job this summer!

Our teachers and other staff spent several days in August preparing for the year. We are expanding our emergency and safety training to include Run/Fight/Hide and Stop the Bleed. While something bad could happen in any school across the country, I am confident that by practicing and considering our responses, as a system we are better prepared and our students will be safer.

Throughout the year, teachers will continue their work around math strategies and positive behavior strategies at the elementary level, continuing the work with standards based grading at the middle school, and the high school will continue implementing practices and processes within the AIW framework. We had an outside speaker for all teachers prior to the start of the year who focused on "visible learning" and teachers will be implementing that work within all the areas.

We welcomed 14 new teachers and 12 new support staff to the district for the new school year. Please extend them a warm welcome as they begin their new roles as Difference Makers!

We have started the fall season of co-curricular activities. We will host four home football games this season including Homecoming on September 27th. It is always great to see the cross country students run the game football in just prior to the start of the game and enjoy the band's half-time show and Hall of Fame Inductions.
