SCHOOL FACILITIES USE CHANGES

The V-S School Board recently made adjustments to the board policy concerning facility use. Their intent is to continue to allow as many outside groups to use our buildings and grounds but recognize there are costs that go with the use. Consequently, there will be increased fees that outside groups will pay to help cover for custodial fees, utilities, and other costs. Groups are classified into five different categories - schoolsponsored or affiliated in serving students directly; nonprofit; nonprofit city, government and political agencies; business or for-profit organizations or individuals within the school district; and out-of-district groups. Rates for the groups vary based on the group (no charge for school-sponsored/affiliated) and on the area of the school (classrooms, cafeterias, gyms, etc.). There will also be a charge for a supervisor to be present.

We will be implementing a new process to schedule facilities that will include access to calendars that show what areas are or are not available. What our website for further updates! To the Vinton-Shellsburg School Community,

It has been a great start to the new school year! August was a full month with registration, computer check-out nights, back-to-school nights, fall sports and activities starting, and the first days of school! Thank you to all of the parents, grandparents, daycare providers, neighbors and others who help get the 1600+ students to school and back each day.

At our first all-staff meeting, I emphasized some of the reasons we should all be proud to be a part of the Vinton-Shellsburg school district. From last spring's assessment data, there are a few highlights:

- *Over 84% of our 11th grade students were proficient in reading and over 90% were proficient in math.
- *Our students in 6th-8th grades have made significant gains in the number who are proficient from six years ago. Almost 93% of our 8th graders were proficient in math; 92% of our 7th graders, and almost 85% of our 6th graders were proficient math. In reading, we had almost 90% of 8th graders, 85% of 7th graders and almost 80% of our 6th graders.
- *At the elementary level, over 90% of our 3rd graders, 88% of our 4th graders and almost 88% of our 5th graders were proficient in reading. Math was almost as impressive with 3rd graders at 88%, 4th graders at 87% and 5th graders at 86%.

While those numbers are impressive, they are even more remarkable when compared to the other schools in the Grant Wood AEA (the schools in Benton, Cedar, Iowa, Johnson, Jones, Linn and Washington counties).

- \Rightarrow Elementary students were 1st in the AEA in reading.
- \Rightarrow Elementary students were 2nd in the AEA in math.
- \Rightarrow Middle School students were 2nd in the AEA in math. (7th and 8th were 1st compared to their peers.)
- \Rightarrow Middle School students were 4th in the AEA in reading.
- \Rightarrow High School students were 4th in the AEA in reading and 5th in math.

Jim Struve, our activities director, recently compiled a summary of 2016-17 activities and it included:

- Several teams and individuals qualified for state competition including both individual and large group speech students, girls' cross country, girls' bowling, two wrestlers, several in girls' and boys' track, and girls' golf.
- Marching Band and Jazz Band received Division I ratings at state festival.
- ◊ Two students were offered Division I scholarships for athletics.

Other reasons to be proud of our district include the facilities our students use every day, the great staff who work with them every day, and the students themselves.

While these data points are from the 2016-17 year, I am confident that we have processes and systems in place that will support another great year of teaching and learning! Our elementary teachers spent a great deal of time this summer preparing to use our new reading series and our middle school math teachers attended training to support their use of a new textbook series.

We have several new staff members who have joined the district including eight teachers. They all bring different experiences, training and passion to their role here in the district. We believe we hired great people who will assist our students in their learning! They will all be difference makers in the lives of our students!

It is great to have everyone back in the buildings and we are positioned for a great school year. Remember – School Board Elections are Tuesday, September 12th with the polls open from 12-8 PM. PLEASE VOTE!

Did you know?

*Starting in kindergarten, too many absences can cause children to fall behind in school; *Missing 10 percent (or about 18 days) can make it harder to learn to read; *Students can fall behind if they miss just one or two days of school every few weeks; *Absences can affect the whole classroom if the teacher has to slow down learning to help children catch up; *Poor attendance can influence whether children read proficiently by the end of third grade.

Vinton-Shellsburg Schools are working to improve chronic absences by working more closely with families.
